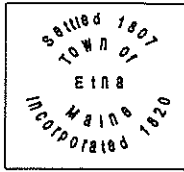

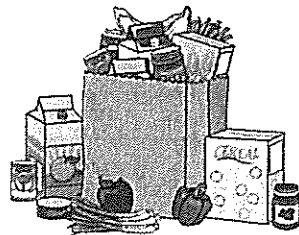

# TOWN OF ETNA RECYCLING GUIDELINES

\*Recycling is picked up EVERY Wednesday. Please keep in mind these lists are not full lists.

\*All recycled items **MUST** be seen. Please place your items in an open container or clear plastic bags.

ITEMS ACCEPTED	ITEMS <b>NOT</b> ACCEPTED
Only Clean #1, #2, and #5 Plastics	Trash/Garbage
Clean Cardboard, Paperboard, and Clean Pizza Boxes	Plastic Bags, Sandwich or Snack Bags, Food Packaging
Clean Glass Jars and Tin Cans	#3, #4, #6 and #7 Plastics
Clean Milk and Juice Cartons	Cloth, Clothing, Shoes, Food
Newspapers and Inserts	Furniture, TV's, Microwaves, Electronics
Magazines, Catalogs, and Phone Books	Bedding or Pillows
Clean Paper Bags	Wood, Lumber or Vinyl Siding
Office Paper, Envelopes and Wrapping Paper	Styrofoam
Shredded Paper (put in clear plastic bags)	Large Metal Parts (from cars, trucks, boats, etc.)
	Plastic Wrap, Film, or Aluminum Foil
	Batteries
	Dishes, Plates, Cups or Ceramic Items
	Paper Towels, Napkins, Tissues, Toilet Paper

*\*NOTE: Driver reserves the right to refuse recycling pickup if recycling guidelines are not followed.*

## Fall Curbside Clean-up

The Town of Etna is providing a fall curbside clean-up day for the residents of Etna. Items should be out by 7:00 a.m. All items must be placed curbside and smaller, loose items **MUST** be in some sort of bag or container.

**ITEMS ACCEPTED:** appliances, mattresses, furniture, metal (tire rims are ok).

**ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED:** yard debris, construction/remodeling debris, chemicals, paint, household trash, electronics, tires.

## Tires & Electronic Waste Clean-up Day

**Saturday, September 30, 2023**

**8:00 a.m. to 12 noon at Town Office Parking Lot**

The Town of Etna is providing a tire and electronics waste clean-up day for the residents of Etna.

Items **MUST** be brought to the Town Office parking lot for drop off between 8:00 a.m. until noon.

**Accepted items:** Any over the road size tires and in any quantity. Tv's, stereos, computers, printers.

\*Please note that no tires on rims will be accepted. \*

## Public Notice

**Snow Plowing:** The town of Etna will not be responsible for damage to mail or newspaper boxes place in the public right-of-way. Mailboxes must be set by Postal Service Guidelines.

**Private Snow Removal:** It is unlawful to plow snow from private property and place it along any public street(including pushing across the street) so that it obstructs the roadway or impedes vehicular traffic. Re: Maine Revised Statutes, Title 29-A, §2396.
